Pulpwood Production^{1/} in the Lake States by County, 1982

Abstract.--Lake States pulpwood production dipped to 5.52 million cords in 1982. Pulpwood production is shown by county and species group in Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.

KEY WORDS: Residue, Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin

Pulpwood production in the Lake States--Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin--fell from 5.60 million cords in 1981 to 5.52 million cords in 1982: Wisconsin produced 2.29 million cords, Michigan 1.75 million cords, and Minnesota 1.48 million cords.

Ninety-two percent came from roundwood (including chips from roundwood); the remainder came from mill residue, such as slabs, edgings, veneer cores, and chips from these materials. Production from softwood and hardwood residue by State was:

Major species harvested were aspen (2,382,000 cords), pine (935,000 cords), maple (345,000 cords), balsam fir (313,000 cords), and birch (247,000 cords).

Wisconsin imported 25 percent of its pulpwood requirements, including 396,000 cords from Michigan, 179,000 cords from Minnesota, 131,000 cords from other (primarily western) States, and 42,000 cords from Canada.

^{1/}Includes logs, bolts, and wood residue used in manufacturing particleboard, waferboard, and oriented strand board.

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Counties cutting more than 100,000 cords were Delta, Menominee, Iron, and Marquette in Michigan; Koochiching, St. Louis, Beltrami, Cass, and Itasca in Minnesota; and Forest, Marinette, Oneida, Vilas, Bayfield, and Price in Wisconsin. These 15 counties furnished 45 percent of the pulpwood produced from roundwood in the Lake States in 1982.
