Pulpwood Production¹ in the Lake States by County, 1987

ABSTRACT.—Lake States pulpwood production declined slightly to 7.69 million cords in 1987. Pulpwood production is shown by county and species group in Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin.

KEY WORDS: Residue, Michigan, Minnesota, Wisconsin.

Pulpwood production in the Lake States—Michigan, Minnesota, and Wisconsin—fell slightly from 7.71 million cords in 1986 to 7.69 million cords in 1987. Wisconsin produced 2.87 million cords, Michigan produced 2.74 million cords, and Minnesota produced 2.08 million cords.

Ninety-two percent of pulpwood came from roundwood (including chips from roundwood); the remainder came from mill residue such as slabs, edgings, veneer cores, and chips from these materials. Production from softwood and hardwood residue by State was:

Major species harvested were aspen (3,571,900 cords), pine (891,900 cords), maple (835,400 cords), birch (526,700 cords), and balsam fir (254,900 cords).

Lake States loggers produced 605 thousand cords of whole tree chips (WTC), 8 percent of the total pulpwood output. Michigan was the principal WTC producer with 505 thousand cords, followed by Minnesota with 72 thousand cords, and Wisconsin with 28 thousand cords.

Counties cutting more than 120 thousand cords each were Delta, Menominee, Marquette, and Ontonagon in Michigan; Koochiching, St. Louis, Beltrami, and Itasca in Minnesota; and Forest, Lincoln, Marinette, Oneida, Bayfield, and Sawyer in Wisconsin. These 14 counties contributed 40 percent of the pulpwood produced from roundwood in the Lake States in 1987.
