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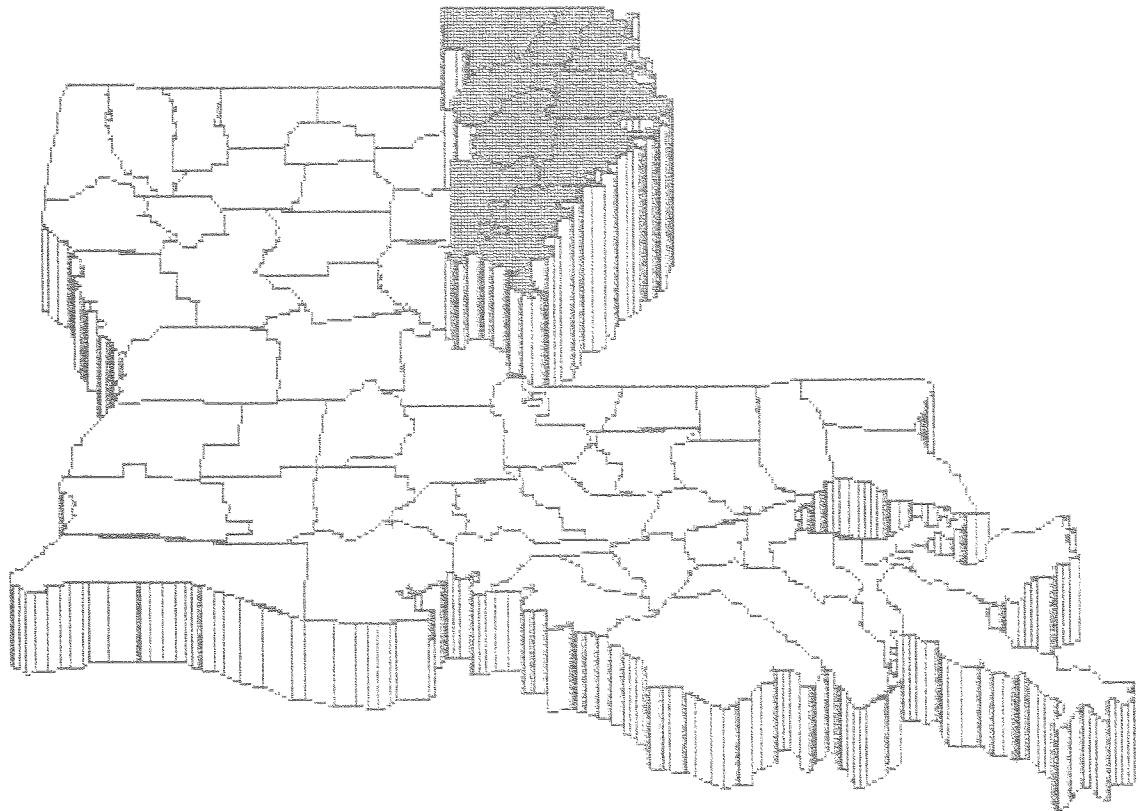
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Forest Statistics for North Delta Louisiana Parishes

SUMMARY

The Southern Forest Survey, an activity of the Southern Forest Experiment Station Forest Inventory and Analysis work unit (FIA), covers the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Tennessee, Texas and the island of Puerto Rico.

This survey is part of the nationwide Forest Survey originally authorized by the McSweeney-McNary Act of 1928. More recent legislation pertinent to the survey mission includes the Forest and Rangeland Renewable Resources Planning Act of 1974 and the Forest Rangeland Renewable Resources Research Act of 1978. The survey mission is to develop, analyze, and maintain renewable forest resource information. This information is essential for formulation of forest policies and programs.

Forest Statistics for North Delta Louisiana Parishes

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HIGHLIGHTS

These tables were derived from data obtained during a 1984 inventory of nine parishes comprising the North Delta Unit of Louisiana (fig. 1). The data on forest acreage and timber volume were secured by a systematic sampling method involving a forest-nonforest classification on aerial photographs and on-the-ground measurements of trees at sample locations. The sample locations were at the intersections of a grid of lines spaced 3 miles apart. At each forest location, per-acre estimates were obtained from 5 BA 37.5 point samples.

The sampling methods were developed to provide suitable State estimates. Estimates for smaller areas are presented, but sampling error increases as the area considered decreases. Sampling errors given in table I are based on one standard deviation or a probability of two chances out of three. To estimate the sampling error for a combination of parishes one can use the following:

where:

SE = standard error of estimate (%)

X = variable of interest (area, volume)

G = group of parishes to be combined

T = total for the unit

Timberland Area

Timberland acreage declined 264,900 acres since 1974 to 913,500 acres. This 22-percent drop is attributable to continued conversion of bottomland hardwoods to agricultural land.

Ownership

Forest industry and nonindustrial private owners decreased their holdings of timberland acreage in the North Delta unit. Forest industry timberland declined 114,300 acres (24 percent) to 364,800 acres and nonindustrial private timberland acreage fell 284,900 acres (43 percent) to 380,500 acres. For comparison between the 1974 and 1984 surveys, nonindustrial private timberland that was leased to forest industry is reported in forest industry acreage.

Forest Type

Forest type acreage has remained relatively stable with the exception of the oak-gum-cypress forest type. That type has lost 307,200 acres since 1974, a 35-percent decline. Continued conversion of timberland to agricultural land is the contributing factor to this decline. The oak-gum-cypress forest type remains the dominant type in the North Delta unit, occupying 61 percent of total timberland.

Stand Size

Acreage of sawtimber, poletimber, and sapling-seedling stands have all declined. Losses are 77,900, 121,400, and 97,300 acres for sawtimber, poletimber, and sapling-seedling stands, respectively. Sawtimber stands now occupy 566,000 acres, a 12 percent drop. Poletimber stands fell from 304,200 acres in 1974 to 183,000 acres in 1984. Sapling-seedling stands dropped from 212,300 acres to 115,100 acres.

Softwood Volume

Softwood growing-stock volume is only 19 percent of the total growing-stock volume in the unit. There was a slight increase from 1974 to a current 232 million cubic feet. Softwood sawtimber volume was 1,070 board feet at the end of the 1984 survey period.

Hardwood Volume

Hardwood growing-stock volume decreased to 1,020 million cubic feet. Likewise, hardwood sawtimber volume

decreased to 3,819 million board feet. Clearing of bottomland hardwoods is the principal cause of decline.

Gross Growth

Growing-stock gross growth for softwood increased to 16 cubic feet per acre per year from 11 cubic feet per acre per year in 1974. Hardwood gross growth is 50 cubic feet per acre per year, no change since the 1974 survey.

Both softwood and hardwood sawtimber gross growth have increased since the 1974 survey. Softwood increased from 50 board feet per acre to a current 75 board feet per acre per year. Hardwood gross growth increased slightly from 200 board feet per acre to 215 board feet per acre.

Removals

Annual removals for softwood and hardwood growing stock averaged 11 and 36 million cubic feet, respectively, for the 1984 survey period. Softwood removals are down from the 1974 survey period when removals exceeded growth.

Number of Trees

The number of live softwood trees has increased in the North Delta unit. Saplings have increased by 13 percent and trees larger than 5.0 inches have increased by 13 percent.

However, because of land clearing of bottomland hardwood areas, hardwood tree numbers show large declines. Hardwood saplings fell by 47 percent while hardwoods larger than 5 inches declined by 22 percent. Future inventory volume for bottomland hardwoods will clearly be on the decline in the North Delta unit.

Net Inventory Change

Softwood growing stock increased 3 million cubic feet annually, an improvement over the 1974 survey period when removals exceeded net annual growth.

Hardwood growing stock increased only 2 million cubic feet annually.

This is a decline from the 13 million cubic foot annual increase that was reported for the 1974 survey period.

Mortality

Average annual mortality is 2 million cubic feet for softwood growing stock and 8 million cubic feet for hardwood growing stock. There was no appreciable change between the 1974 and 1984 survey periods.

Cull Volume

There has been no appreciable change in cull volume since 1974. Softwood cull volume is 10 million cubic feet. Hardwood cull volume is 230 million cubic feet. Softwood cull volume is only 4 percent of total live tree softwood volume. Eighteen percent of total live tree hardwood volume is in cull trees.

Tables 1-25 were developed to provide compatibility among Forest Inventory and Analysis Projects. Tables 26-36 are supplementary tables and may change from unit to unit or State to State to address specific issues.

DEFINITION OF TERMS

Average annual mortality.--Average annual sound-wood volume of live trees, dying from natural causes.

Average annual removals.--Average annual net volume of growing-stock trees removed from the inventory by harvesting, cultural operations such as timber-stand improvement, land-clearing, or changes in land use.

Average net annual growth.--Average annual net volume increase for the intersurvey period.

Forest type.--A classification of forest land based upon the species forming a plurality of live-tree stocking.

Growing-stock trees.--Live trees of commercial species. Rough and rotten trees are excluded.

Growing-stock volume.--Net volume in cubic feet of growing-stock trees at least 5.0 inches in diameter at

breast height, from a 1-foot stump to a minimum 4.0-inch top diameter outside bark of the central stem, or to the point where the central stem breaks into limbs.

Noncommercial species.--Tree species of typically small size, poor form, or inferior quality, which normally do not develop into trees suitable for industrial wood products.

Physiographic site.--A classification of forest land according to the availability of moisture for tree growth. Xeric-low or deficient in moisture. Mesic-a moderate amount of moisture. Hydric-an abundance or over abundance of moisture.

Poletimber trees.--Growing-stock trees of commercial species at least 5.0 inches in diameter at breast height, but smaller than sawtimber size.

Rotten trees.--Live trees of commercial species that do not contain at least one 12-foot saw log, now or prospectively, primarily because of rot.

Rough trees.--Live trees of commercial species that do not contain at least one 12-foot saw log, now or prospectively, primarily because of roughness or poor form. (Includes all live trees of noncommercial species.)

Sawtimber trees.--Live trees that are of commercial species, contain at least a 12-foot saw log, and meet regional specifications for freedom from defect. Softwoods must be at least 9.0 inches in diameter at breast height and hardwoods at least 11.0 inches.

Sawtimber volume.--Net volume of the saw-log portion of live sawtimber in board feet, International 1/4-inch rule and in cubic feet.

Site class.--A classification of forest land in terms of inherent capacity to grow crops of industrial wood.

Stand-size class.--A classification of forest land based on the size class of growing-stock trees on the area; that is, sawtimber, poletimber, or sapling and seedling.

Timberland.--Forest land that is producing, or is capable of producing, crops of industrial wood and not withdrawn from timber utilization. Timberland is synonymous with "commercial forest land" in prior reports.

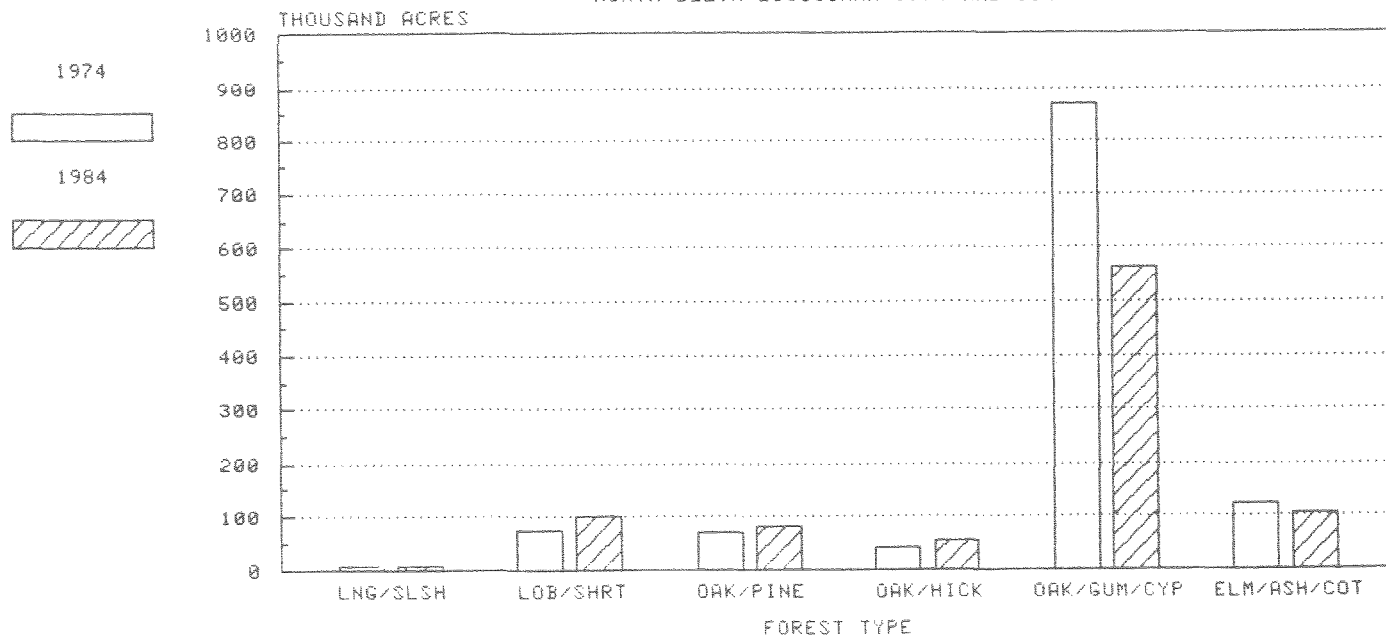

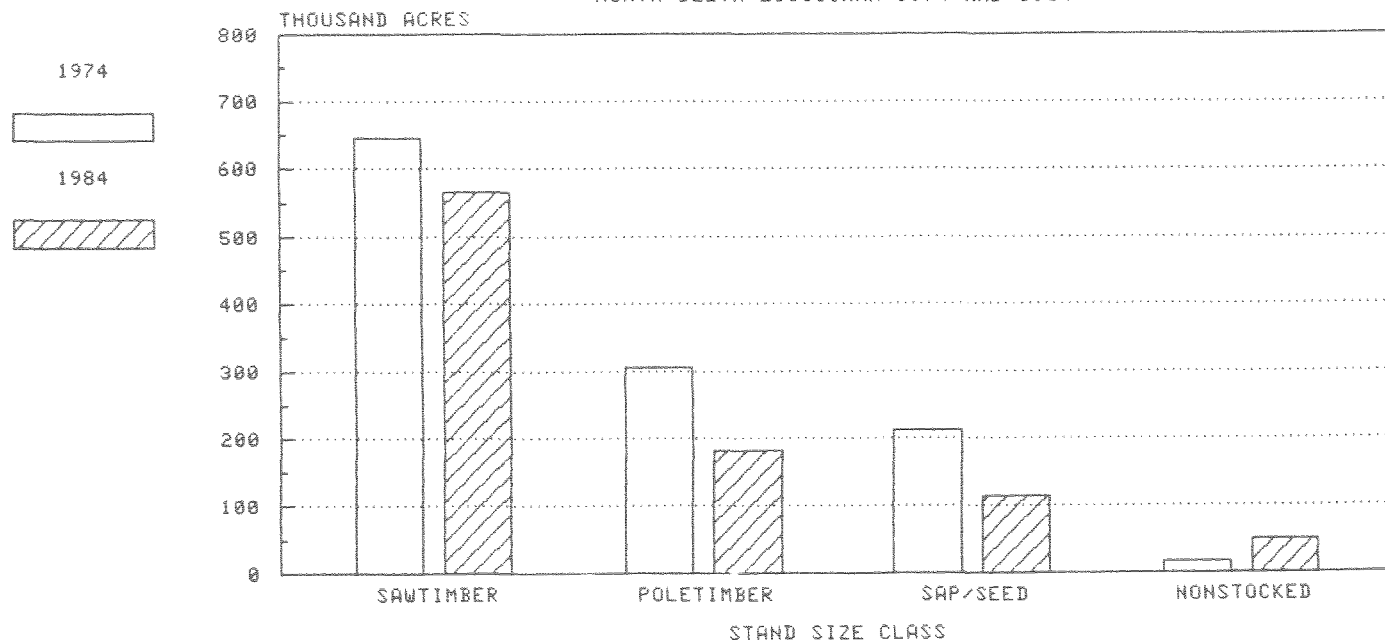
AREA OF TIMBERLAND BY FOREST TYPE

NORTH DELTA LOUISIANA 1974 AND 1984



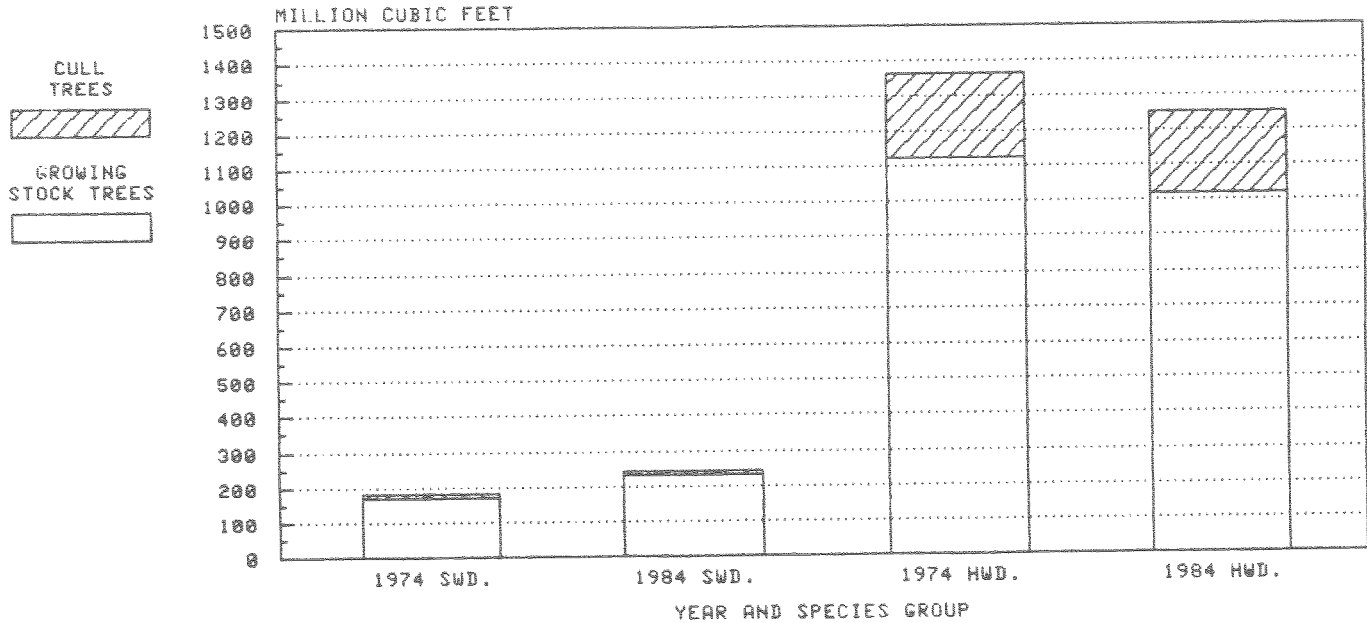
AREA OF TIMBERLAND BY STAND SIZE CLASS

NORTH DELTA LOUISIANA 1974 AND 1984



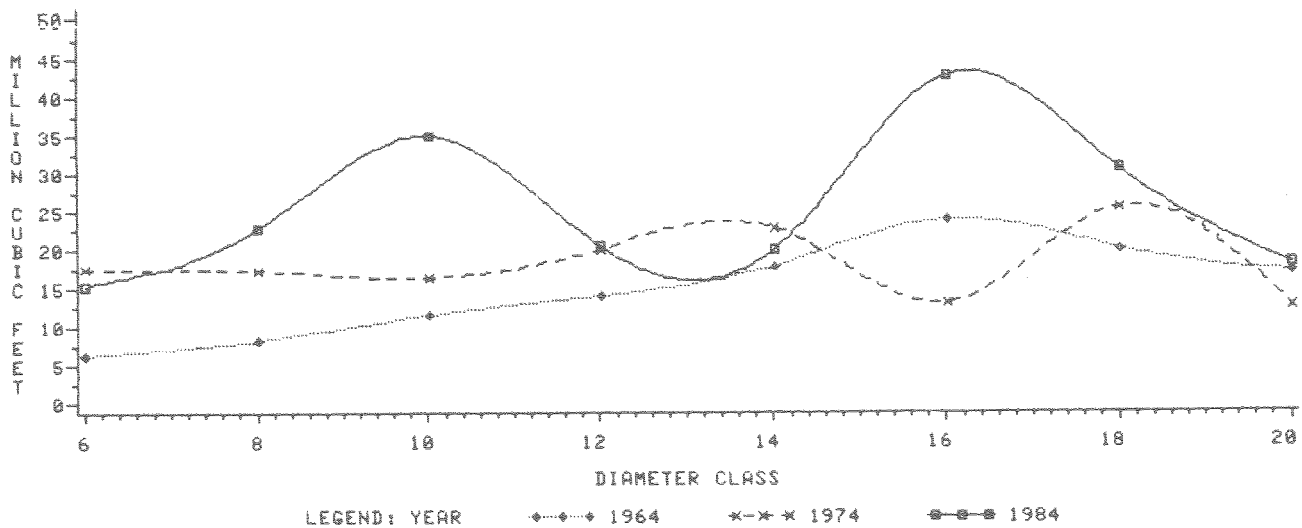
TIMBER VOLUME BY TREE CLASS AND SPECIES

NORTH DELTA LOUISIANA 1974 AND 1984

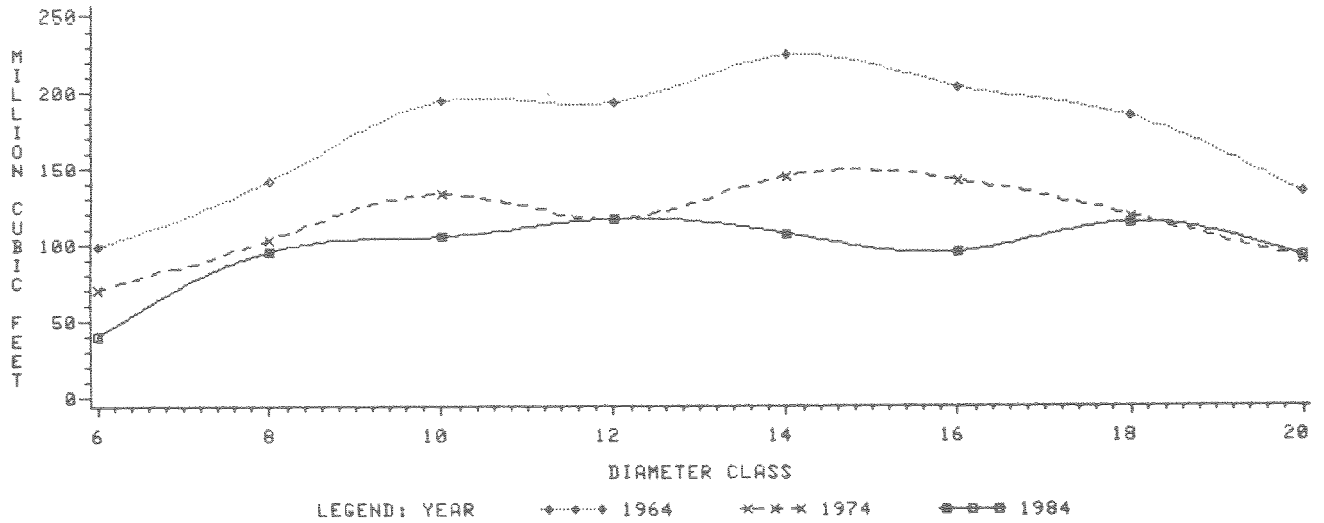


SOFTWOOD GROWING STOCK VOLUME BY DBH CLASS

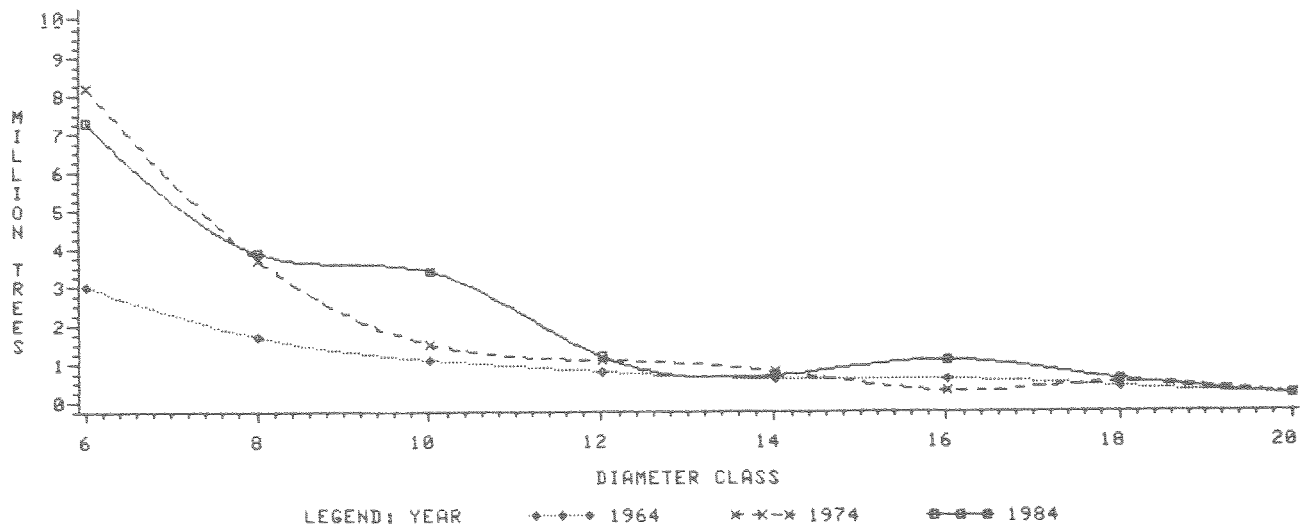

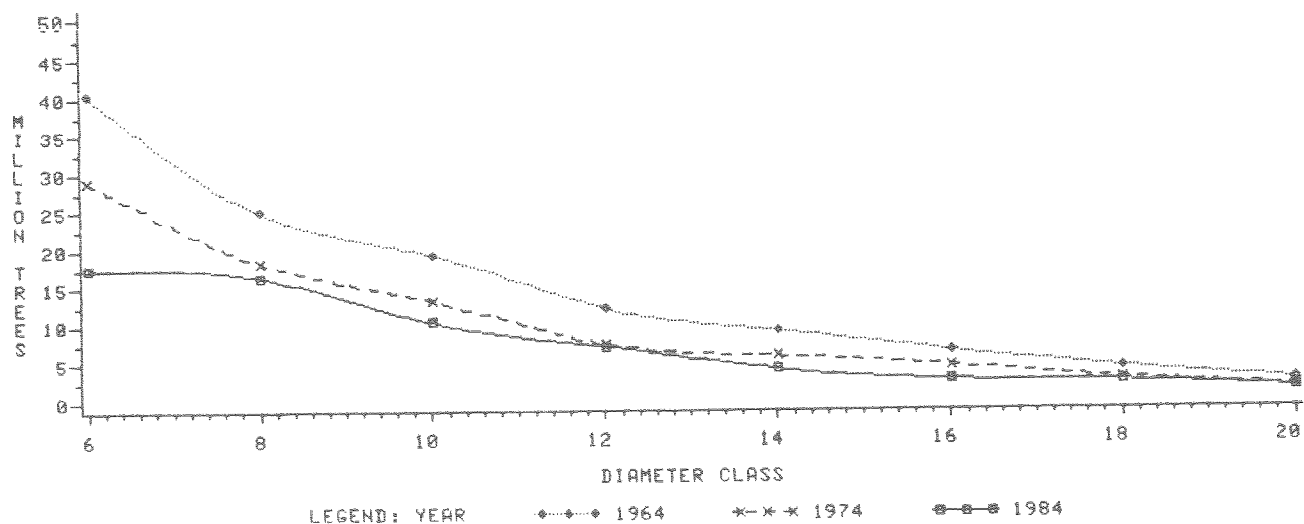
HARDWOOD GROWING STOCK VOLUME BY DBH CLASS NORTH DELTA LOUISIANA 1964, 1974, AND 1984



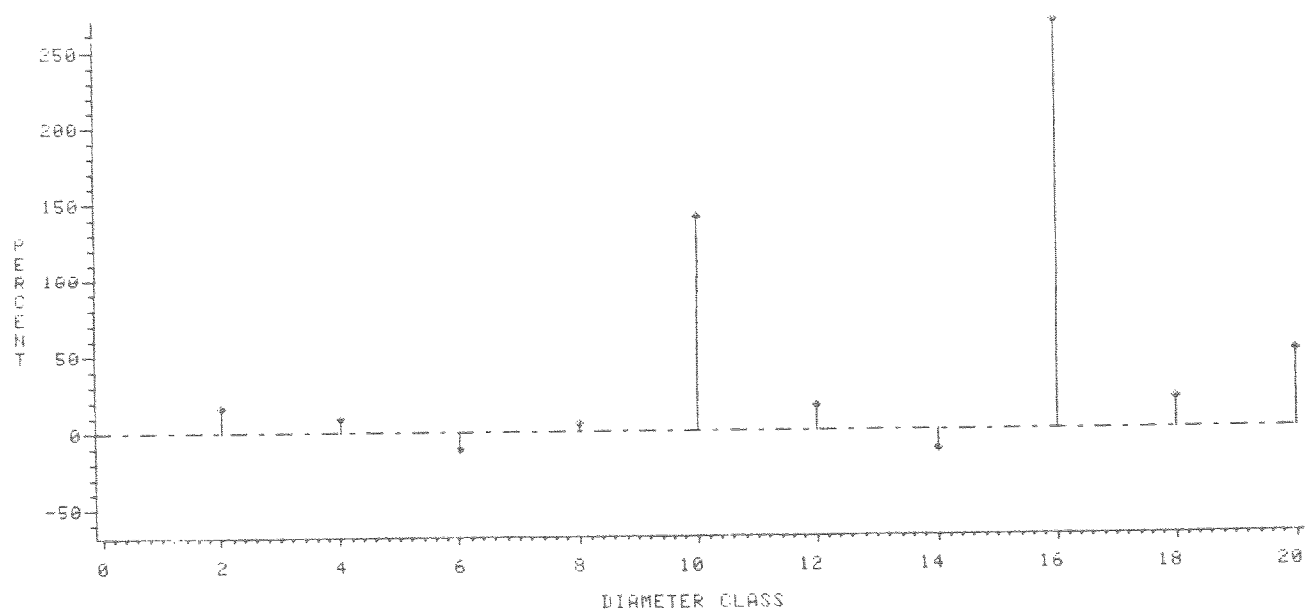

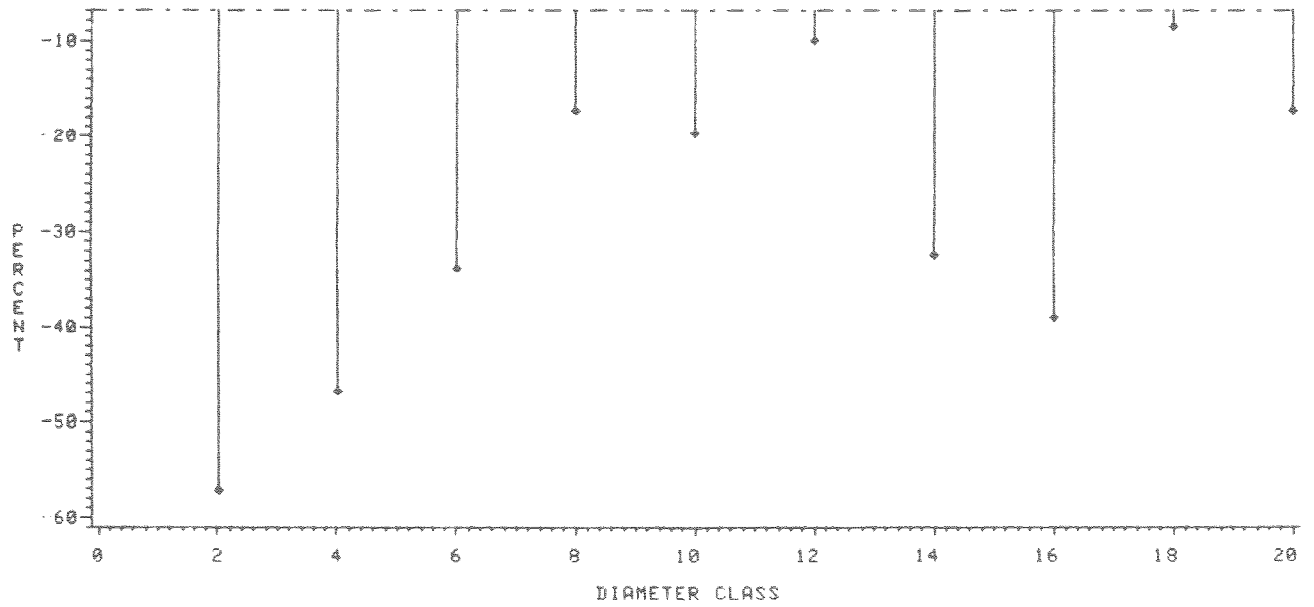

CHANGE IN NUMBER OF LIVE SOFTWOOD TREES NORTH DELTA LOUISIANA 1974 TO 1984

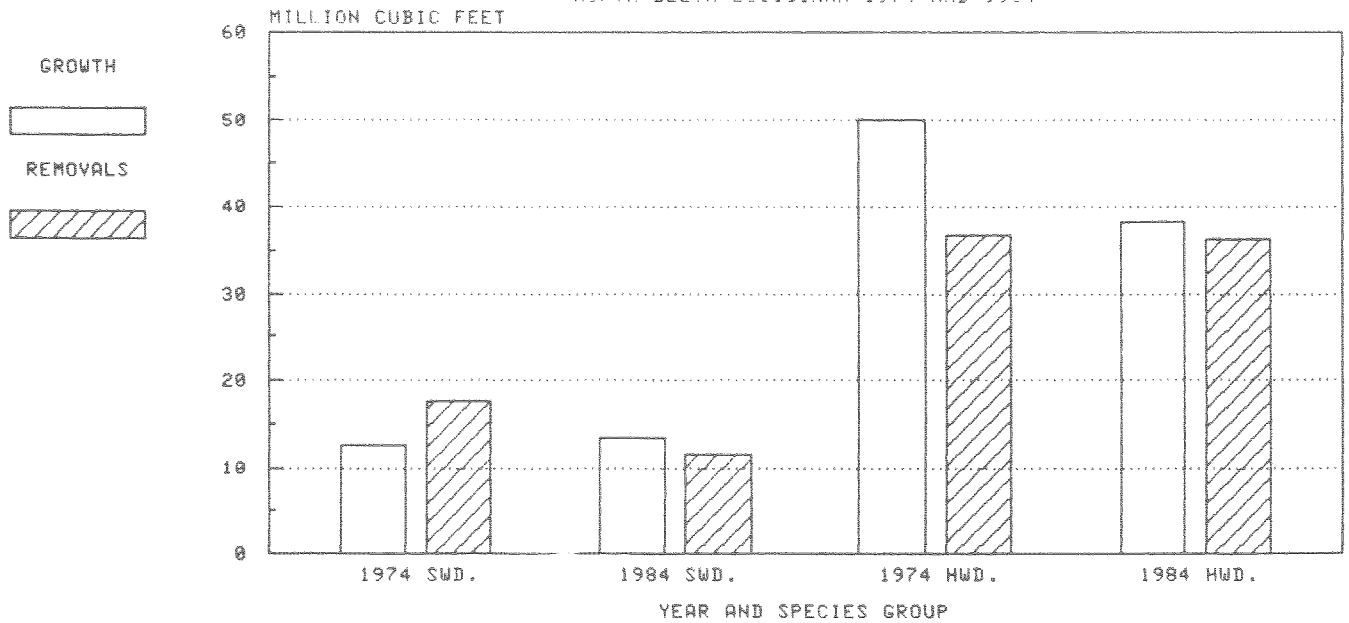


CHANGE IN NUMBER OF LIVE HARDWOOD TREES NORTH DELTA LOUISIANA 1974 TO 1984
