

Southern Pulpwood Production, 1972

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The South harvested a record high of 44,279,487 cords of pulpwood in 1972. Roundwood output and residue use expanded in both softwoods and hardwoods for a total gain of 2,365,671 cords. Through the 1960's southern pulpwood production averaged a 6-percent increase per year. In 1970, the rise was 3 percent, and in 1971 a slight decline occurred. With a 6-percent increase in 1972, the South is again in pace with the trend set in the sixties.

Production was up in 10 States (table 1). Alabama had the largest gain, about 708,000

cords. North Carolina was second with an increase of 452,000 cords, and Georgia's output rose 307,000 cords. Mississippi and Virginia were the only States that recorded a decline in total output. Oklahoma accounted for only 1 percent of the South's total output, but more than doubled its production.

Georgia is still the region's top producer with about 7.6 million cords. Alabama is second with just under 7 million cords. Mississippi remains third with about 4.6 million cords, despite declines for the last 3 years.

Roundwood production in 1972 increased 3 percent, with most Southern States showing gains (table 2). Softwood roundwood rose by 3 percent, hardwood by 12 percent. Oklahoma had the largest percentage increase, 212; the gain was ascribable to recent expansion of pulpmill capacity in the State. Alabama was the leader in volume with an increase of 600,000 cords. Five States recorded an increase in both softwood and hardwood output, Tennessee being the only State down in both categories. Virginia's softwood roundwood harvest fell for the seventh consecutive year and is now only 58 percent of the 1965 peak.

Species composition changed very little as softwood roundwood decreased slightly to just under three-fourths of the total production

(table 3). The hardwood cut was made up of 42 percent oaks, 31 percent gums, and 27 percent other species. The volume of gums declined as oaks and other hardwoods increased.

Choctaw County in Alabama, which has been one of the top producers of round pulpwood in the past, was again the leader with 279,470 cords. McCurtain County, Oklahoma, was second, followed by Sabine and Vernon Parishes in Louisiana. In 1972, there were 68 counties which produced over 100,000 cords of roundwood. Alabama led with 18 counties and Louisiana was next with 11 parishes.

As a special feature, figures 1-4 have been prepared to depict regionwide patterns of pro-

duction and competition for roundwood (competition has been defined in terms of the number of pulp mills buying wood in a county). The last previous maps of this kind presented data for 1967. As might be expected from silvicultural considerations, areas of concentration are much the same as they were 6 years ago. The most notable changes have been the general intensification of activity and a broadening of interest in hardwood.

The use of plant byproducts increased by some 749,000 cords, or 7 percent over the previous year (table 4). Softwood residue use rose 9 percent while hardwoods gained 2 percent. More than 81 percent of the residues

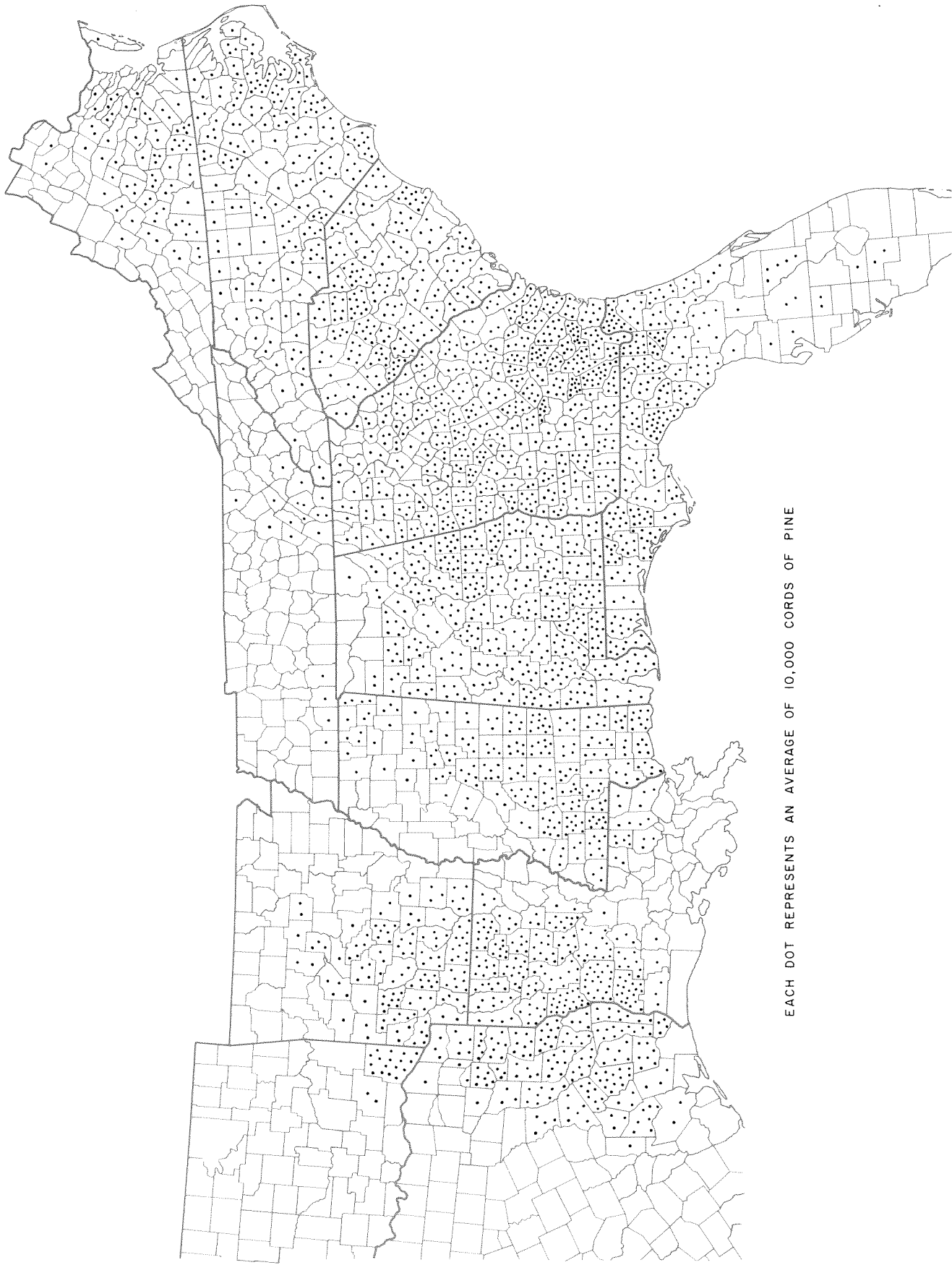

were softwood and more than 93 percent were received at the mill in the form of chips. Residues accounted for just under one-fourth of total pulpwood receipts, a slight increase over the 1971 ratio.

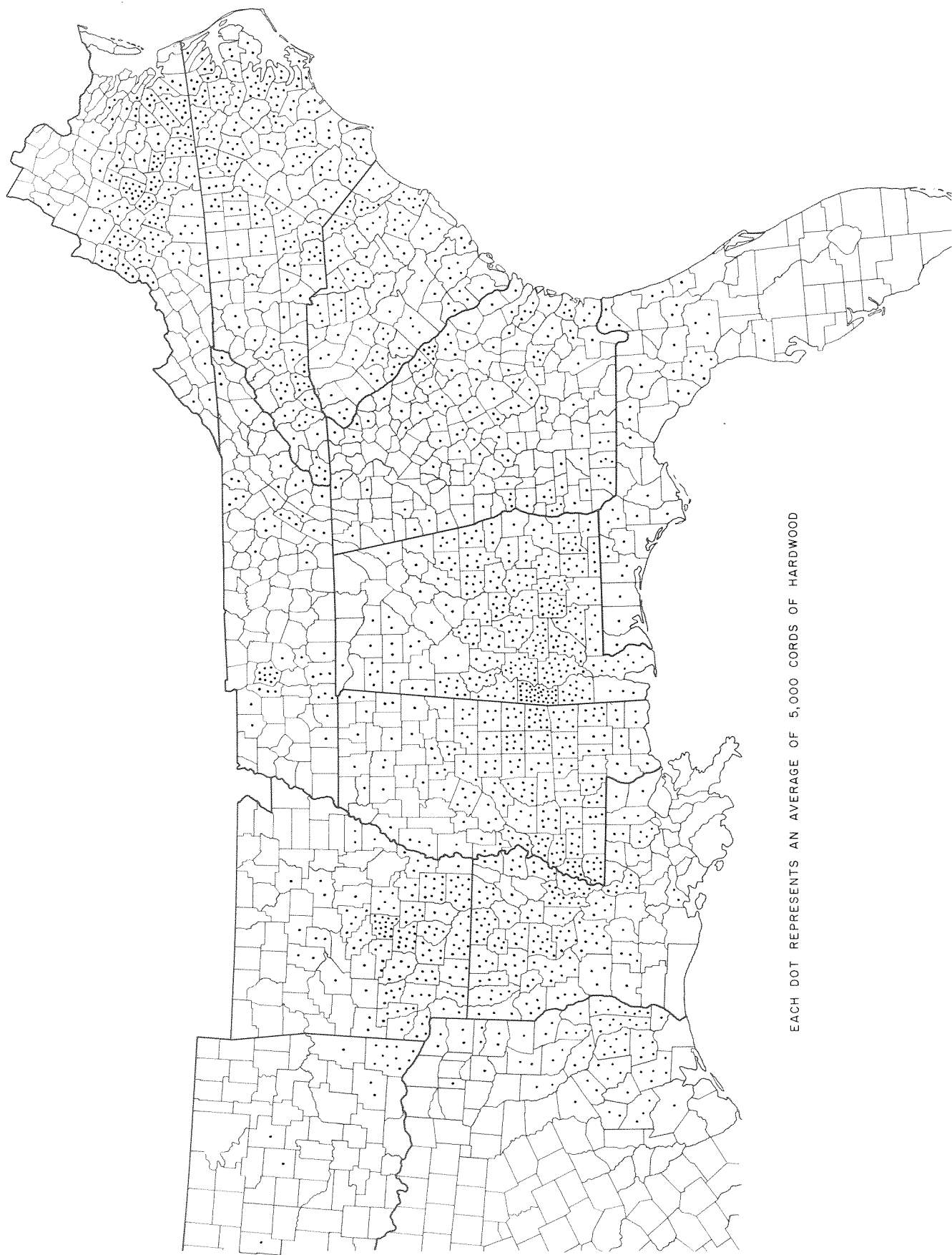
Volume of residues going to pulpmills is determined by the amount of lumber and plywood manufactured, and by the percentage of sawmills that are equipped with residue chippers or chipping headrigs. Residue utilization made large gains throughout the 1960's, partly because small mills were closing down and lumber production was being concentrated at

plants large enough to afford equipment for converting waste portions of saw logs to chips. The process of concentration is now well advanced, and it is likely that most coarse residues are being used.

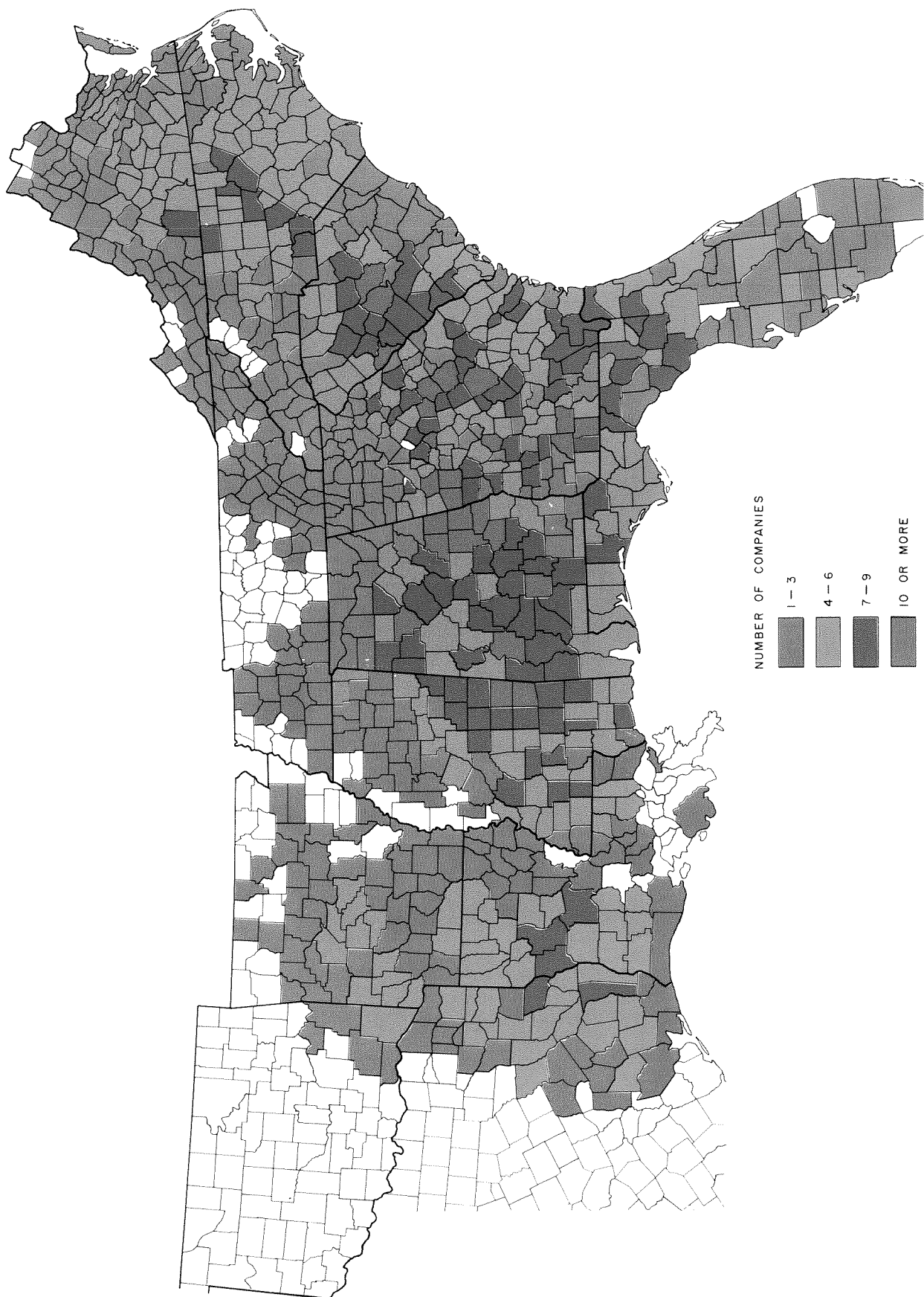
Daily pulping capacity at the South's 109 pulpmills (fig. 5, p. 21) was 88,124 tons in 1972, an increase of 1 percent. By the end of the year four new mills were under construction, one each in Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, and Texas. Southern pulpwood also went to 15 mills in seven States outside the region.

EACH DOT REPRESENTS AN AVERAGE OF 5,000 CORDS OF HARDWOOD



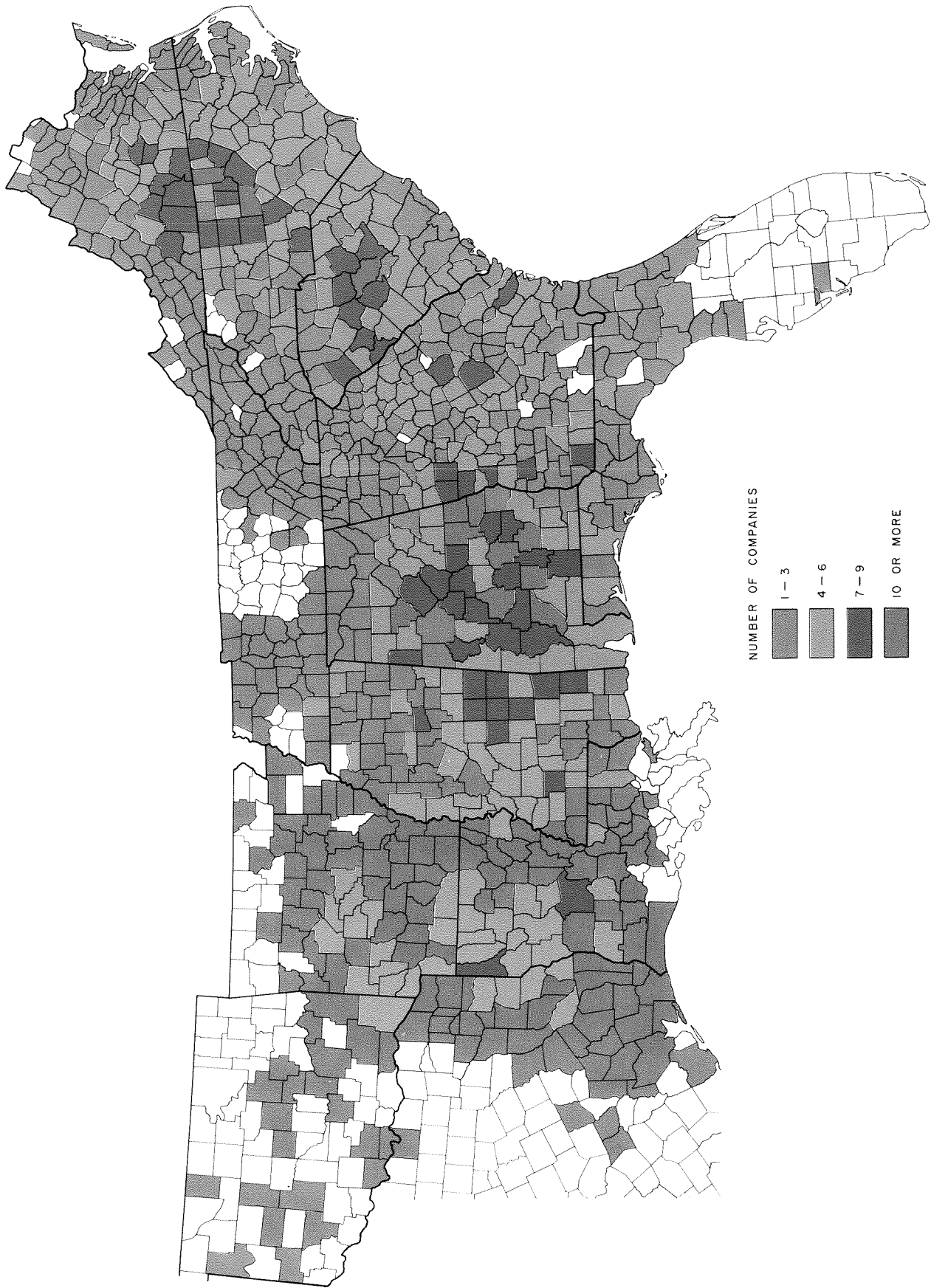

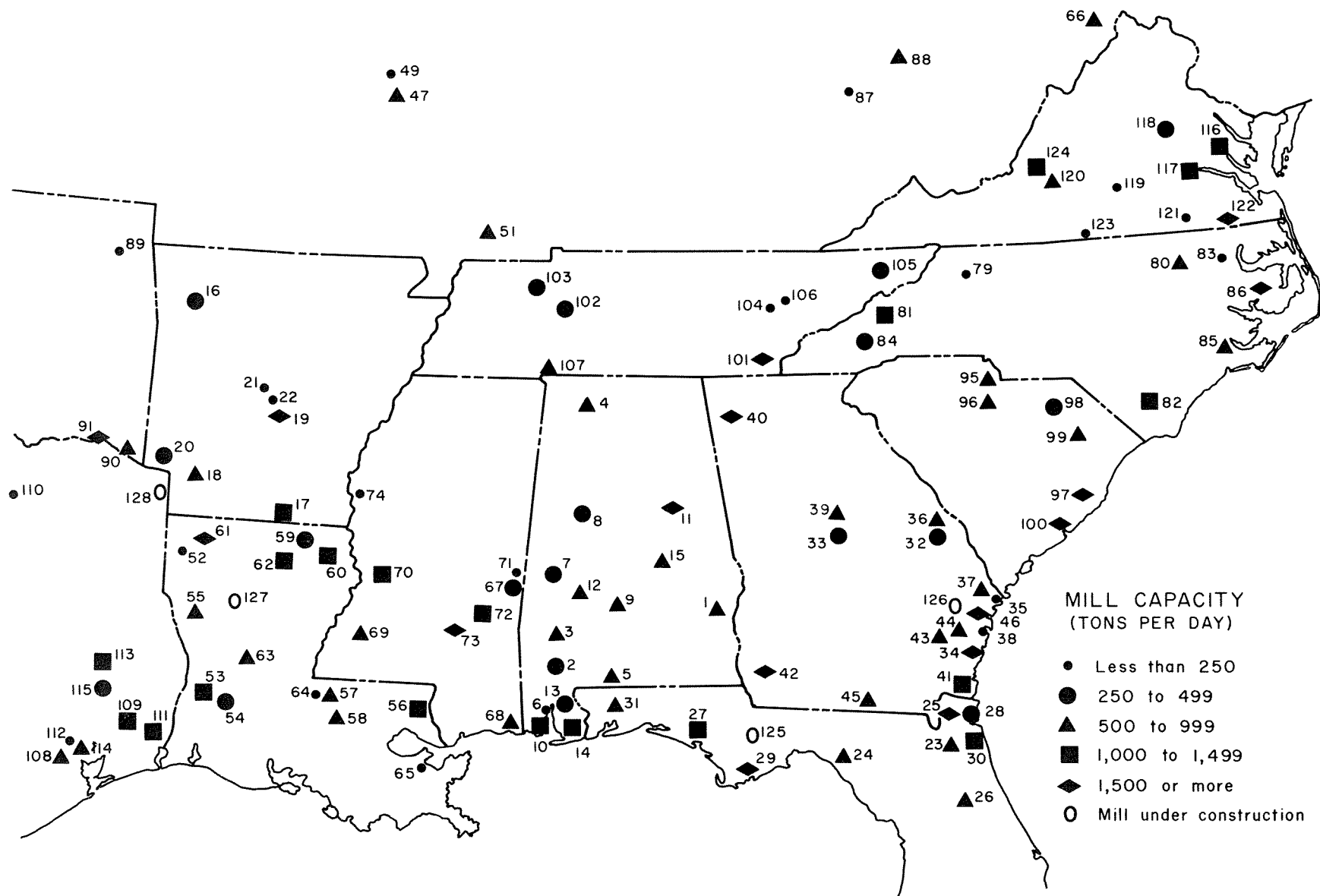
