



Irrigation

Once planted, the tree acquires water through its roots to carry out its metabolic processes. This is why irrigation plays a fundamental role in maintaining a tree.

Did you know that a tree planted in a sandy or well-drained soil requires a daily intake of about 3 to 5 gallons of water for every inch of its trunk diameter?

That is, if the tree to be planted in this type of soil has a trunk with a diameter of 4 inches, it will need 12 to 15 gallons of water per day to satisfy its basic needs.
